



## FRISCO TERRAIN PARK

This winter Summit County is giving you a new option to shred. Don't waste time circling the big parking lots for a spot or sitting in the gondola when all you really want to do is make contact with those rails you were thinking about the entire drive up.

Frisco's Peninsula Adventure Park is set to open in early December and is going to be fully stocked for non-stop entertainment. This park will feature an enormous multi-lane tubing hill and Nordic Skiing Center, but what we know you're really interested in is the brand new terrain park.

The park will feature mostly beginner and intermediate hits that are lower to the ground, so it's a good place to nail that 360 before you throw it off a big kicker on the mountain. The \$29 entry fee provides you access to the magic-carpet lift that services both the park and tubing hill. It's open from Thursday to Monday, noon to dusk, so feel

free to sleep in a bit. This is the one place that you can hit snooze for an hour and still get fresh tracks. When the sun sets and you're looking for a hot drink and a cozy couch, head to the new 4,000-square-foot day lodge to unlace those boots.

This new park is a good option for both Summit County locals and commuting boarders. Not a lot of people know about it yet, so you can be one of the first to check it out. (We'll keep you posted with opening day information as it becomes available.) It's located right off Highway 9 in Frisco. Parking is available at the day lodge. There will be various punch passes and season passes available so whether you're hitting it up before, after or instead of your normal spots, you can always show up, strap in and hit Colorado's newest terrain park.
